**2. Matters Arising:** The wall at Lady Stair Park and the drainage problems at the key store has now been fixed. But Gordon highlighted the drains at Lady Stair Park are needing attention.

**3. Correspondence:** A request to the Micro Grant fund for £493.00 for the yearly hall fees for the senior citizens exercise class who meet once a week in the hall, all was with agreement. A thank you card from Irene Fisher for the wonderful Christmas Party she attended in December she had an enjoyable time and wanted to thank the OLCC.

**3. Christmas Parties:** The Christmas Parties numbers was down from previous years, this year dates might be better earlier in December. The cost of both parties was £600. But we were entered in to a competition by the key store and won £150.00 off the Christmas tree. Feed-back from the parties everyone enjoyed themselves.

**4. Development Trust:** Mike gave an update on the trust, new heating system is to be installed in the hall to help reduce running heating costs. Down stairs in the back room is going to be turned in to a meeting room. New disabled access is going to be from the mason car park at the back of the hall, power is being installed for the new projector and speakers. The hall costs £10,000 a year to run so the hall needs more bookings to help with the running costs. Councillor Katie mentioned she could use the hall for council meetings to boost the bookings, 21 Main Street the tenders are in. Tenders are out for the Glen for an audit. A successful grant was secured for £38,500 for the Glen to resurface the bottom paths and install galvanised steel bridges and new signage.

**6. Reports:** Derek asked about core foot paths and why no maintenance has been done on them for a long time. Councillor Katie says that the council do not have the budget for them to be kept. Freddie highlighted from the 1<sup>st</sup> April the public toilets will no longer be cleaned by the council, Freddie asks the councillor to step in and help as it's a very viable service to the village. He also highlighted that himself opens and closes the toilets every day to provide this service to the public, Katie says that the budget cuts are still in talks. Ian highlighted that Councillor David Ingles attendance for OLCC Meetings is very poor, Councillor Katie said that he also attended the Cree Valley CC on the same night, but he will be attending in 2019. Ian mentioned that there is two properties in Glenluce that have had scaffolding up for a long time.

**7. Post Office:** An application is going to be submitted for the help of the running costs for the post office that is provided to the village once a week in the hall, again this is a viable service to the people of Glenluce and surrounding areas. Freddie is going to meet up with the post master and Tracey the development officer to discuss it further.
